This is the fourth in a series of articles I have written for *Tiresmoke*. Each of the articles have been about one of the previous three Corvettes we have owned. This article is about our latest addition the 2018 Carbon 65 Grand Sport Convertible.

In January 2018 Janice and I decided to celebrate our 50th Anniversary with a small gathering of family and friends. Plans began for a mid-June celebration. Little did we realize at the time efforts lay ahead. During the planning process I mentioned that I thought I would like to get a new Corvette. Much to my surprise Janice wholeheartedly endorsed the idea as a treat to ourselves.

The first obstacle was that I was not sure what I really wanted so I began a search of the Internet, but nothing really jumped out and said "this is the CAR." I even contemplated ordering a new 2018 or 2019 with a Museum Delivery option. Finding the "right" Corvette was not an urgent issue. As time passed and as June approached a lot of effort went into planning for the Anniversary, it was almost as hard as planning for a wedding. The event was a great success, family came from NY, Texas, Florida and North Carolina. It was a great opportunity to see family and friends. However, a few weeks afterwards Janice was diagnosed with a major medical issue, had to have surgery and a lengthy recovery. I became the chief cook, bottle washer, chauffer, handyman, and all around go getter. Any thoughts of a new Corvette were put on hold.

And the Matrix Gray Carbon 65 had some of the same distinctive features but with a lot more pizzazz.

While taking advantage of the Internet I had seen several Carbon 65's being advertised. In early January 2019 I found a used 2018 Carbon 65 with only 2,000 miles. I lingered around for a couple weeks and the car seemed to still be available. I fired off an e-mail and received a quick reply with some additional details. All that was needed was a decision to move ahead. Fate was sealed, a price agreed upon, and arrangements were made for delivery from St. Louis.

The Carbon 65 Grand Sport is one of only 27 Convertibles and it joins the 1996 and the 2004 as a distinctive model to represent the Corvette legacy. We are proud to own each of them and are having fun cruising even in the limits of the pandemic, we just do it without company. We do miss the camaraderie with our Corvette friends.

On manual steering 1963-1976 Corvettes, the relay rod is often overlooked when attempting to fix sloppy steering. However, it can be one of the leading causes of an ill-feeling steering wheel. In a previous article, we showed you how to rebuild your Corvette's steering box. Now we're moving to the relay rod. Actually, it is best to do both of these at the same time; that way you only have to pay for one front end alignment. Because it is located near the front tire, the relay rod gets lots of abuse and gets hit by a lot of road debris. You can overhaul your relay rod with a new rebuild kit from Zip Corvette Parts, which comes with everything needed for a complete refurbishing.

The most difficult part of the relay rod rebuild is actually removing the relay rod from your Corvette. It is possible to rebuild the relay rod still in the vehicle if you prefer not to remove it. This is also a good time to replace the idler arm assembly. At this point your Corvette's steering system is almost entirely rebuilt. The steering procedure will only take about an hour, assuming the relay rod is already removed from your Corvette. You will need a 5/16-inch socket and wrench, a large flat-bladed screwdriver, and some MAPP gas, available from any hardware store. Not everyone will need to heat the relay rod, so try yours first before buying the MAPP gas.



01: Our Corvette's relay rod was almost completely worn out.

02: To get started, remove the seal retaining clamp. It is attached with two bolts.

03: With the seal off, you can see the road grime and dirt that have worked their way past the seal ball stud over the years.

04: With the retaining bracket off, remove the seal. Use a pair of cutters or dykes to remove the cotter pin from the end of the relay rod. You may have to clean the end of your Corvette steering relay rod to be able to see it.



05: Next, unscrew the end plug, using caution because they can be tight and you do not want to strip the slot. If you run into difficulty, you may need to apply some heat with a torch to get it to break free. If you do not have access to an torch, then you can pick up some MAPP gas at your local hardware store. Make sure you use MAPP gas though because propane will not get hot enough to make much difference.

06: With the end plug off, remove the spring and ball stud from the end. You may need to use a flat-blade screw driver to pry them out.

07: Now you can remove the ball stud by sliding it towards the end of the relay rod, then pulling straight out. You will see the cut out in the relay rod for the ball to fit through.

08: Gently tap the end of the relay rod on your bench until the spring and seat falls out, then clean the inside of the relay rod to remove all old grease and dirt. Go ahead and remove the zerk fitting on the bottom of the relay rod also.

The National Corvette Museum 26th Anniversary Celebration will be held September 2-5, 2020. Special procedures are in place to protect the health of all visitors attending the event during the ongoing pandemic.

This year's Anniversary Celebration will focus on the diversity of the people that Corvette has brought together for a look back on the Museum's history and forward to the future! Registered participants can enjoy 4 days of activities in and around the Museum including access to interesting and unique road tours, special video presentations, raffles, and more during this event.



A FULL Seminar schedule will be coming soon to the Museum website. Presentations will be a mixture of in person and Virtual. Several presentations including General Motors will be virtual only. Onsite participants will have spaces both inside and outside the Museum to view presentations live. Both areas will be adequately distanced.

Anniversary registration is \$20 for Lifetime members, \$25 for members and \$35 for non-members and the deadline for online registration is 5:00 pm central time, **Friday, August 14th, 2020**. Early registration includes a hard card badge, lanyard, event pin and dash plaque.

The NCM Motorsports Park is now offering you the opportunity to test the 2020 "Next Generation" Stingray Corvette. The track offers a fleet of seven "C8s" you can choose from to drive—which is a great opportunity for you and a group of friends to get out on the track together. While walk-up laps are offered many week-days, advanced reservations are highly recommended.





TECH CORNER (cont'd)



09: Here is the Zip Corvette Parts kit, part number <u>SC-725</u>, which includes everything needed to rebuild a Corvette relay rod except for the grease.



10: Now that you have a clean relay rod, lets start the assembly process. Start by packing the inside of the relay rod with heavy-duty bearing grease.

11: Next, insert the first spring. After you have pushed the spring as far in as you can, insert the seat. There is a small machined area of the seat that needs to be faced in the up position, which you can see through the slot in the relay rod.

12: Once the seat is in place, grease the ball end of the stud and insert it through the top of the relay rod. Then slide it into the seat.



13: With the ball stud in place, install the second seat and spring. Make sure you use plenty of grease. Note that this time the seat goes in first and then the spring.

14: Now you can screw the end plug into the end of the relay rod. Tighten it until the slot in the end plug lines up with holes in the end of the relay rod. The plug should be flush with the end of the relay rod.

15: Place the cotter pin through the hole to lock the end plug in place.

16: Place the rubber seal over the relay rod and then bolt down the retaining clamp. Then install the new zerk fitting.


